13	STIPULATION FOR SETTLEMENT OF DISCIPLINARY
14	ACTION PURSUANT TO NAC 645C.610 (3)
15	1. <u>PARTIES.</u> This Stipulation is entered into by and between the Petitioner, the REAL
16	ESTATE DIVISION, DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY, STATE OF NEVADA (the "Division"),
17	by and through its Administrator, SHARATH CHANDRA (the "Administrator"), and the Respondent,
18	DONALD E. BEEBE, JR. (whether one or more hereinafter the "Respondent"), who at relevant times
19	was licensed by the State of Nevada, license number(s) A.0004097-CR. This Stipulation is entered
20	into upon mutual agreement with the decision of the Appraisal Advisory Review Committee (the
21	"AARC"), which was reached at its informal conference held on January 21, 2020, in LAS VEGAS,
22	NEVADA. Members of the AARC present were John S. Wright, Chairperson, R. Scott Dugan and Tio
23	DIFrederico.
24	2. <u>AUTHORITY OF THE APPRAISAL ADVISORY REVIEW COMMITTEE</u> , The Appraisal
25	Advisory Review Committee has authority to enter into this Stipulation with the Respondent
26	pursuant to NAC 645C.610 (3).
27	3. <u>FINDINGS.</u> The AARC has found that the Respondent, while licensed, certified or
28	registered as a Nevada Appraiser, committed violations of chapter 645C of Nevada Revised Statutes

and Nevada Administrative Code and/or USPAP. A description of the conduct in which these violations were committed is set forth in specificity in the Summary of Facts which is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "A". The Administrator has the authority, pursuant to NAC 645C.600 (2), to establish an advisory committee in an attempt to review this matter informally and recommend a resolution.

4. <u>NO ADMISSION OF GUILT</u>. The Respondent does not admit or deny the findings of the AARC, choosing to remain silent, but does agree that the findings establish a prima facie case for the discipline set forth below and stipulates, subject to the limitations and conditions set forth below, that the Division shall not be required to provide further evidence of such allegations.

5. <u>SETTLEMENT FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION</u>. As set forth above, the AARC is authorized under NAC 645C.610 to impose an administrative fine, upon final approval by the Commission. The Division also has the option to file a complaint with the Nevada Commission of Appraisers of Real Estate (the "Commission"). The Commission has the authority pursuant to NRS 645C.460(2)(d) to impose a fine of up to \$10,000 for each violation alleged or to suspend or revoke the Respondent's certificate, license or registration card. The parties, however, desire to compromise and settle the instant controversy, without a hearing, upon the following terms and conditions:

Committee Recommendations:

a. Not less than 7 hours continued education in the Cost Approach
 b. Not less than 3 hours continued education in Residential Adjustments
 c. Not less than 7 hours continued education in Residential Report Writing
 d. Not less than 7 hours continued education In Highest and Best Use
 For a total of not less than 24 hours of continued education, to be completed with in one(1) year
 of the Appraisal Commission President signing the Stipulated Agreement. It was recommended
 by AARC that the course when possible be taken in a classroom setting. Continued education will

b. Public Record. RESPONDENT and the DIVISION agree that by entering into this 1 Stipulation, the DIVISION does not concede any defense or mitigation RESPONDENT may assert, 2 and the parties agree that the DIVISION will not publicize the instant disciplinary matter, except as 3 set forth below, and that once this Stipulation is approved and fully performed, the DIVISION will 4 close its file in this matter. RESPONDENT understands that the public records law may require the DIVISION to make available for inspection this Stipulation and related documents. RESPONDENT 5 also understands that the DIVISION may share the content of this Stipulation and related 6 documents with any governmental or professional organization or member of the public; 7

Newsletter. RESPONDENT and the DIVISION agree that the DIVISION, at its C. discretion, may publish in the newsletter an anonymous summary of the alleged offenses of RESPONDENT and the terms of this Stipulation, with the understanding of all parties that such publication will not specifically name RESPONDENT or make reference to any other party; RESPONDENT will be referred to only as a licensee in the State of Nevada. It is further understood 12 by the parties that this publication is for educational purposes only and to advise other licensees 13 of the alleged violation(s) and that disciplinary action has been taken by the DIVISION;

15 RESPONDENT agrees that if the required education is not completed in the time allowed above, 16 RESPONDENT'S license will be automatically suspended until such time as the fine is paid and continuing education requirement satisfied. The DIVISION may, at its option, rescind this 17 Stipulation and proceed with filing a Complaint before the Commission. Further, recovery actions 18 for the administrative fines may be instituted by the DIVISION; 19

No other remedies. Assuming Respondent complies with the terms of this e. stipulation, the Division agrees not to pursue any other or greater remedies or fines in connection with the conduct referenced in above unless stipulation is rescinded.

f. Waiver by Respondent. RESPONDENT agrees and understands that by entering into this Stipulation, RESPONDENT is waiving his/herright to a hearing at which RESPONDENT may present evidence in his/her defense and to be represented by counsel, to judicial review of any adverse decision by the Commission, and to present his/her defense to a Commission which has had no prior familiarity with the instant matter. The Commission members who review this matter for approval of this Stipulation may be the same members who ultimately hear the 28 DIVISION'S complaint if this Stipulation is either not approved by the Commission or is not timely

performed by RESPONDENT; and

Attorney fees and other costs. Each party shall bear its own attorney's fees and g. other costs not specifically set forth in this Stipulation.

6. **RELEASE.** In consideration of execution of this Stipulation, the Respondent for himself/herself or his/her heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby release, remiss, and forever discharge the State of Nevada, the Department of Business and Industry of the State of Nevada, the Division, and each of their members, agents, and employees in their individual and representative capacities, from any and all manner of actions, causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims, and demands whatsoever, known and unknown, in law or equity, that the Respondents ever had, now has, may have, or claims to have against any or all of the persons or entities named in this section, arising out of or by reason of the 10 Division's investigation, this disciplinary action, or any other matter relating thereto.

11 7. **INDEMNIFICATION.** Respondent hereby indemnifies and holds harmless the State 12 of Nevada, the Department of Business and Industry of the State of Nevada, the Division, and each 13 of their members, agents, and employees in their individual and representative capacities against 14 any and all claims, suits, and actions brought against said persons and/or entities by reason of the 15 investigation of the allegations in the Complaint, this disciplinary action and all other matters 16 relating thereto, and against any and all expenses, damages, and costs, including court costs and attorney fees, which may be sustained by the persons and/or entities named in this section as a 17 result of said claims, suits, and actions. 18

8. **COMMISSION APPROVAL OF STIPULATION NECESSARY.**

Once executed, this Stipulation will be filed with the Commission and will be put on the agenda for approval at its meeting, which by Nevada law is a public meeting. At that time, the DIVISION will recommend to the Commission approval of the Stipulation. RESPONDENT acknowledges and agrees that the Commission may approve this Stipulation, reject it, or suggest different terms which must be communicated to RESPONDENT and accepted or rejected by RESPONDENT before any such amendment shall become effective.

25 9. SETTLEMENT DISCUSSIONS NOT EVIDENCE. Any statements made during the 26 discussions leading up to this Stipulation may not be discussed or introduced into evidence at any 27 hearing. However, evidence of the Respondent's failure to abide by the terms of any Stipulation 28 entered into with the Division, may be introduced at a hearing and used against the Respondent.
