ORDER

This matter came on for a status hearing before the Commission for Common-Interest Communities and Condominium Hotels, Department of Business and Industry, State of Nevada (the "Commission"), during a regular agenda on November 6, 2018, at the Nevada State Business Center, 3300 W. Sahara Avenue, Nevada Room, Suite 400, Las Vegas, Nevada 89102 with videoconferencing to Division of Insurance, 1818 E. College Parkway, Suite 103, Carson City, Nevada 89706 (the "Hearing"). Attorney Daniel Hansen appeared on behalf of Vistana Condominium Owners Association, Anthony Kneip, Lynn Williams and Ardyce Nelson (the "Respondents").

Michelle Briggs, Senior Deputy Attorney General with the Nevada Attorney General's Office, appeared on behalf of the Real Estate Division of the Department of Business and Industry, State of Nevada (the "Division").

Pursuant to the Commission's Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order dated September 19, 2017 (2017 Order), as amended by Order filed March 13, 2018 and Order filed July 6, 2018, the Respondents were to report on the status of their progress of the requirements in the Orders.

The 2017 Order provides that each Respondent "shall complete 9 hours of board

education classes offered by the Division no later than August 30, 2018, and shall verify completion of this education requirement with the Commission."

Respondents provided evidence of classes as follows:

Lynn Williams completed 3½ hours of classes offered by the Division and 6 hours of CAM continuing education classes.

Anthony Kneip completed 11 hours of CAM continuing education classes.

Ardyce Nelson completed 6 hours of CAM continuing education classes, 3 hours were after the August 30, 2018 deadline.

Lynn Williams and Anthony Kneip are current on their \$100 per month fine payments.

Ardyce Nelson has not made a payment for November 2018.

The Division argued that the classes taken by the board members were not as ordered by the Commission in that they are not board education classes offered by the Division. Mr. Hansen argued that the 2017 Order does not specify which classes must be taken, so the board members reasonably believed the classes they took were as required by the 2017 Order. He argued Ms. Nelson needs additional time to complete the classes due to health issues. The Commission heard testimony from Monique Williamson regarding her contact with the Association's attorney, Richard Haskin, regarding the classes the Division had available and would offer to the board members. The Commission requested testimony from a Vistana homeowner in attendance at the Hearing, Chris Rees, regarding the Association's upcoming election.

Being fully apprised in the premises, and good cause appearing to the Commission, by a unanimous vote, the Commission found RESPONDENTS ANTHONY KNEIP, LYNN WILLIAMS and ARDYCE NELSON in default of the 2017 Order, as amended. The 2017 Order provides that failure of the Respondents to satisfy the requirements of the order will result in removal from the Association's board.
