NEVADA COMMISSION OF COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITIES AND CONDOMINIUM HOTELS

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

This matter came on for hearing before the Commission for Common-Interest Communities and Condominium Hotels, Department of Business and Industry, State of Nevada (the "Commission"), during a regular agenda on November 6, 2018 at the Nevada State Business Center, 3300 W. Sahara Avenue, Nevada Room, Suite 400, Las Vegas, Nevada 89102 with videoconferencing to Division of Insurance, 1818 E. College Parkway, Suite 103, Carson City, Nevada 89706 (the "Hearing"). The Respondent, Pecos Creek Homeowners Association (the "Association"), appeared through a board member, Lacramiora Stoian. Michelle D. Briggs, Esq., Senior Deputy Attorney General with the Nevada Attorney General's Office, appeared on behalf of the Real Estate Division of the Department of Business and Industry, State of Nevada (the "Division").

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Commission finds the following facts are true.

- On June 19, 2018, board members, Sherryl Baca and Andrew Dionne, attended the Commission's meeting as requested by the Commission by order filed March 13, 2018.
- 2. Sherryl Baca and Andrew Dionne were ordered to attend the Commission's meeting on August 28, 2018 for additional follow up on the board's

requirements.

- 3. The Commission's order from the June 19 meeting was issued in written form filed July 6, 2018.
- 2. Sherryl Baca and Andrew Dionne failed to appear before the Commission on August 28, 2018.
- 3. The Commission issued an Order filed August 30, 2018 requiring all of the Association's board members to attend the November Commission meeting which includes notice of sanctions if the board members failed to appear.
 - 4. Sherryl Baca and Andrew Dionne failed to appear for a second time.
- Lacramiora Stoian testified before the Commission that she was largely left out of decisions made by Sherryl Baca and Andrew Dionne and felt threatened.
- 6. The board had not met to discuss the funding plan for their reserve deficit.

The Commission heard testimony from Phillip Michaelson who is the Association's new manager. Mr. Michaelson provided a copy of his management contract and an email from Ms. Baca with the subject of "budget proposal." The email from Ms. Baca includes an altered version of what was already presented to the Commission in August by the Association's prior manager. Ms. Stoian testified that the document was Ms. Baca's reserve study. The Commission reviewed the Association's audit as was provided by the Association's prior manager to the Division.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the testimony provided to the Commission by Ms. Stoian and Mr. Michaelson, being fully apprised in the premises, and good cause appearing to the Commission, by a unanimous vote, the Commission found the following violation of law:

Sherryl Baca and Andrew Dionne are in default of the Commission's Order

filed August 30, 2018 by knowingly and willfully failing to appear before the Commission as ordered by the Commission by orders filed July 6, 2018 and August 30, 2018 in violation of NRS 116.785(3).

ORDER

The Commission, by unanimous vote, ORDERED the following:

- SHERRYL BACA and ANDREW DIONNE shall each personally pay an administrative fine to the Division in the amount of \$1,000 no later than January 1, 2019.
- 2. SHERRYL BACA and ANDREW DIONNE shall be immediately removed from the board of the Association and may not serve as a board member or officer of the Association or any other common-interest community in the State of Nevada for a period of no less than 3 years from the date of this Order and in no event prior to full payment of the administrative fine ordered against them.
- The Association shall immediately begin the process of conducting an election to fill all open board positions.
- 4. Lacramiora Stoian, as the sole board member, may take whatever action is necessary to maintain the business of the Association.
- 5. The Association shall report at the Commission's next board meeting regarding its reserve funding plan.
- 6. The Commission's next board meeting will be March 12-14, 2019, unless otherwise directed.

2	timely pay the fine, including action to reduce this order to a judgment. Further, if
3	collection goes through the State of Nevada, then SHERRYL BACA and ANDREW
4	DIONNE shall also pay the costs associated with collection.
