15                                   **RESPONSE TO COMPLAINT FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION AND NOTICE OF**  
16                                   **HEARING**

17                   This Response is submitted by Boyack Orme & Anthony as counsel for the above-captioned  
18                   Respondents.

19                   The Complaint for Disciplinary Action and Notice of Hearing ("Complaint"), filed January  
20                   13, 2017, makes three allegations, titled as "Violations of Law" ("Violations"). See Complaint at 3.  
21                   Each of these are repeated and addressed below.

22                                   **VIOLATION 1**

23                   This Violation alleges that "RESPONDENTS BARBARA STARK, MELANI LAVER, and  
24                   NINETTE MACEDO violated NRS 116.3103 (through NAC 116.405(5)(a)) by failing to act in the  
25                   best interests of the Association by impeding or otherwise interfering with an investigation of the  
26                   Division by failing to comply with a request by the Division to provide information and documents."  
27                   *Id.*

28                   Respondents attempted to the best of their ability to comply with the Division's requests and

1 investigation. Respondents have recently retained counsel to assist them in complying with their  
2 ongoing obligations to the Division. Accordingly, Respondents will ensure ongoing and future  
3 compliance/cooperation with the Division's requests.

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5 **VIOLATION 2**

6 Violation 2 alleges that "RESPONDENTS BARBARA STARK, MELANI LAVER, and  
7 NINETTE MACEDO violated NRS 116.3103 (through NAC 116.405(5)(a)) by failing to act in the  
8 best interests of the Association by failing to cause the Association to comply with all applicable  
9 federal, state and local laws and regulations." *Id.*

10 Respondents were previously a self-managed association. During that period, board members  
11 on two occasions embezzled funds from the Association, and otherwise engaged in improper, illegal,  
12 and malevolent conduct that harmed the Association. The Association is still attempting to recover  
13 from these actions, and is behind on the funding of its reserves, in addition to other compliance  
14 matters. However, the Respondents are committed to bringing the Association in compliance, having  
15 retained the services of a management company and counsel to assist them with their rebuilding.

16 The Respondents represent that they will do everything to ensure total compliance with all  
17 applicable rules, regulations, policies, and laws.

19 **VIOLATION 3**

20 Violation 3 alleges that the above-named Respondents "violated NRS 116.3115 by failing  
21 to establish adequate reserves." *Id.*

22 Respondents repeat their response to Violation 2, above, and represent to this Commission  
23 and to the Division that they are engaged in the process to conduct a proper reserve study, and to  
24 begin funding the reserve in accordance with their obligations.

1 CONCLUSION

2 This Association has had a difficult time until very recently, but is now "on the mend". The  
3 current Board is working to repair the damage done by decades of self-management and malfeasance  
4 by prior, self-interested board members. The progress is slow, but ongoing and deliberate. With luck,  
5 and professional direction, the Association will be brought into compliance (or will have made  
6 substantial progress) in time for the Commission's next regular meeting.

7 Accordingly, Respondents request that this matter be continued to allow for further progress,  
8 with a status check to be held at the next Commission hearing.
