STATUS CHECK

This matter came on for hearing before the Commission for Common-Interest Communities and Condominium Hotels, State of Nevada (the "Commission") during a regular agenda set on a three-day stack beginning at 9:00 a.m. on June 10, 2025 (the "Hearing"). Board President Christine Ramos appeared on behalf of Daybreak at Sunrise Highlands Homeowners Association ("RESPONDENT"), and reported that Board Members Treasurer Andy Ramos and Secretary Yoandry Sanchez¹ were unable to attend due to work, also with Supervising Community Manager Ashley Leavens (CAM.0008646-SUPR) and provisional community manager Crystal Rymer (CAM.0010497-PROV), and Lucille Sanchez representing Complete Association Management Company ("CAMCO") (CAM.0009298-SUPR). Christal P. Keegan, Deputy Attorney General with the Nevada Attorney General's Office, appeared on behalf of the Real Estate Division of the Department of Business and Industry, State of Nevada (the "Division").

Pursuant to the Commission's Order filed April 1, 2025, the RESPONDENT appeared at the Commission Meeting to address its breach of the Order Terms Nos. 3 and 5.
